THE FOUR 'R's

- **RIGHTS**Students have the **right** to:

1. Be treated with respect and courtesy.

2. High quality teaching.

3. A safe and secure learning environment.

4. Unhindered learning.

5. The facilities to support and enhance their learning.

6. Opportunities to learn beyond the school day.

• **RESPONSIBILITIES.....**

Students are expected to show responsibility by:

1. Being courteous and polite.
2. Working to the best of their ability.
3. Showing care and concern for other students and people in the local community respecting their right to hold different views.
4. Allowing others to work unhindered.
5. Respecting school facilities and the property of others.
6. Remaining within the permitted areas.

However, rights are forfeit when responsibility is not exercised

• **RULES**

Students are asked to observe a code of conduct based on 5 clear principles that are printed in the Student Planner and displayed on classroom walls.

1.RESPECT

We will be polite to each other, respect each other (staff and pupils), and respect our property and our right to work.

2.CALM

We will move calmly along the corridor and enter rooms quietly when told.

3.LISTEN

We will listen to staff and follow their instructions without interrupting – responding in the proper way.

4.EQUIPPED

We will arrive on time appropriately equipped for lessons with pens, pencils, erasers, ruler, compass, protractor and calculator.

5.WORK

We will work to the very best of our abilities.
