



Geography

Years 7 – 9.

Throughout year seven to nine, students study a variety of different topics. Topics include geographical skills, hazards, geography of sport, China, Africa, rivers, coasts and glaciers. Students also develop their map work, graph and enquiry skills as well as numeracy and literacy in preparation for GCSE.

Years 10 and 11:

In years ten and eleven students will study the Edexcel A Geography which includes geographical skills and challenges. At least two days fieldwork will be completed on both the human and physical environment. We will look at current issues such as development, water, cities and energy, but also at traditional approaches to Geography such as coasts, glaciers and biodiversity.

Post 16:

A level geography is a two year course consisting of both human and physical geography. Students investigate in detail different topics such as coasts, rivers, development, hazards and climate change and analyse how affect the different topics and how we influence the environment. They complete fieldwork out of school in a number of different environments.
