



## Pupil Premium Report September 2019

### Number of Pupils in 18 -19

There were **116 pupils** eligible for the pupil premium in 18 - 19. 20 of those were in year 11

### Incoming Budget last year

We received **£108,760**.in the 2018-19 budget for these pupils.

### Current Year 19 -20

There are **127 pupils** eligible for the pupil premium 19 - 20

We have received **£119.050**.

### Background

- The Pupil Premium was introduced to provide additional funding for disadvantaged pupils. This funding is linked to individual pupils i.e. those that are eligible for free school meals (FSM, or have been at any time in the last 6 years), looked after children (CLA) and those from families with parents in the armed forces. Funding is calculated from the school census returns.

The aim of the Pupil Premium is to raise the achievement of these pupils and diminish the difference between Pupil Premium pupils and non-Pupil Premium pupils.

The amounts of funding granted to Norton Canes High School are;

- £1,320 per secondary pupil 2019-2020
- £1,900 per pupil who has been in care but now adopted
- £300 per pupil to support emotional wellbeing of service children

### Our Priorities

Our data suggests Pupil Premium pupils sometimes have lower school attendance and can miss periods of education; many of our pupils need significant interventions with English and maths. We have used some of the funding to implement specialist programmes such as Accelerated Reading, Bedrock and NINJA maths programmes. Excellent staffing and external services have been secured in relation to supporting attendance, behaviour and social and emotional wellbeing. In addition, we employ specialist tutors to work on specific targeted interventions. We aim to engage parents wherever possible and we use online resources that parents can access to assist their child with their learning.

### Outcomes for pupil premium pupils

Outcomes improved considerably last year 18 – 19 (see table) and the gap has narrowed significantly between pupil premium pupils and non-pupil premium pupils. Our figures are in line with national expectations.

### Governors

The link governor for pupil premium is Mrs Whiteman, she will review progress with Mr Stokes AHT who is the SLT member responsible for PP and CLA.

Full Governors receive a report each term as an appendix to the headteacher's report.

Finance committee are responsible for overseeing funding allocation.

The data committee are responsible for tracking progress and measuring impact.

### Children Looked After
